A Love Story From Dear John!

I'll start by letting you know, if you haven't seen it already, that Ash Wednesday shares the same calendar date as Valentine's Day this year. Perhaps you remember this happening six years ago. The last time before 2018? 1945. (It'll come again in 2029 and 2040, so be ready!)

Valentine's Day has long been celebrated as a special day to express love. Valentine's Day is for hearts excitedly skipping a beat, for a romantic dinner out, for exchanging a sentimental card, for stealing a quick smile, wink, or kiss. You wouldn't think that Ash Wednesday would share too much in common with Valentine's Day. Ash Wednesday is a day when we consider our sinfulness. We talk about repentance and sorrow, sackcloth and ashes, and everything else reminding us that we're not perfect people.

Yet, in perhaps the most significant account ever recorded of the burden caused by sin, the Gospel writer John writes his introductory line as if he's writing a love story:

"It was just before the Passover Feast. Jesus knew that the time had come for Him to leave this world and go to the Father. <u>Having loved His own</u> who were in the world, He now showed them the full extent of His love."

What follows over the next eight chapters of John is an eye-witness account of the final hours before Jesus died on the cross, paying with His life the price necessary to remove the burden of sin from every person who ever lived. The guilt of sin was transferred from me – to Jesus. From you – to Jesus. My sin cost Jesus His life! And He lovingly paid that price for me and for every person in the world. Through God's gracious gift of

faith, the gift of forgiveness and new life is freely given to all who believe in Him!

Now that's a love story! Beneath the story of ashes and sorrow over sin is the amazingly deep love story of our God who is not afraid to step forward and declare His love to people who don't deserve to be loved. The sins come into the picture because they are a regrettable fact of life. They need to be reckoned with. Trying to hide them behind our back while seeking to steal a kiss with the Almighty doesn't yield good results. But our Lord, who knows and sees everything we are and everything we aren't, has demonstrated His love for us in this: that while we were still sinners, Christ Jesus died for us! (See Romans 5).

So, yes, Ash Wednesday once again marks the beginning of the greatest love story ever told. Did you know that John calls himself "the disciple whom Jesus loved" (thus my reference to "Dear John"). To hear this love story from his perspective is to gain special insight into the depth of Jesus' love for each one of us. The Gospel of John is a "Dear John letter" that tells of the greatest commitment of love you can ever know. It tells of our God who never leaves you – never forsakes you!

While we will continue "The Story" on the Sundays during Lent, we will take time out for special focus on God's love story for us in the passion of our Savior Jesus on Wednesday evenings. Come, join us for supper from 5 PM – 6:10 PM and worship service at 6:30 PM.



FURNITURE MISSION IS ALSO LOOKING FOR FURNITURE TO GIVE TO FAMILIES.

You can call for pick-up, but there is a fee for this. Otherwise, bring items to the store at 209 N Nesmith Ave. Here's what they need:

- all sizes of mattresses (even baby mattresses) must be clean and no pets have been on them
- small appliances such as microwaves, toasters, toaster ovens, mixers, blenders
- bed frames all sizes (no headboards or footboards); end tables, side tables, kitchen tables, coffee tables; dressers and chests; book cases, small TV stands,
- sofas & love seats, rockers, recliners, & stuffed chairs (no pets have been on them)

Note Items they cannot accept: Large appliances such as stoves & refrigerators; Large entertainment centers; Curio cabinets & hutches; Captains' beds and large armoires desks; Daybeds, trundle beds

LUTHERAN IN WOMEN (LWML)



also known as Women in Mission is an official auxiliary of the LCMS, and formally recognized by the LCMS in 1942. Originally, the Ladies would gather for meetings and socials and were called the Ladies Aid. As Lutheran Women in Mission, we joyfully proclaim Christ, support missions, and equip women to honor God by serving others. The LWML is the leading group where each woman is welcomed and encouraged to use her unique God-given gifts as she supports global missions and serves the Lord with gladness.

We support our local, district and national Missions with our Mites. This is based on the Widow's Mite, found in Luke 21:1-4. She gave all she had to live on. We put all our spare change in our Mite Boxes. The Mite Box was started in 1928 when every woman who participated in Ladies Aid was given a box. Receipts from the 92 Ladies Aid societies totaled \$6,651.31 in 1930.

One of our events to help with our Missions is our SOUPer Bowl Sunday lunch fundraiser. We team up with our high school youth to make soup, pulled pork for sandwiches! You can order these lunches on the forms in the hall at church or online at memoriallutheran.net. Order your lunches by Feb. 4, & pick them up on Sunday, Feb. 11. Pick-up times are noted on the order forms. Funds raised go toward the high school youth attending the NYG as well as our local LWML missions here at Memorial.

We are inviting all the women of Memorial to come. Fellowship hour starts at 9am and the Prayer Service will begin at 10am in Café Logos.
