Forgiveness for one another (a gift from our Heavenly Father that flows through us to others) is the key to healthy relationships. We give up the "right" to get even with someone

who's hurt us. We choose to look at another person and see possibilities for growth. We look at ourselves and see opportunities for growth. We set aside self-centeredness and consider the needs of those around us.

How important for families. How important for our church family. How important for brothers and sisters in Christ as we encourage one another to live with hope for each new day. How important for our witness to an unbelieving world of the unsurpassed love of our Lord Jesus!

Thank God for His promised forgiveness as we confess our sins to Him! Thank God for His Word that announces how God has loved us and has sent His Son to take the punishment of our sin even while we were yet sinners and enemies of God (see Romans 5:6-11). ### The April mites in action: Propelling the Gospel LAMP Ministry, Inc. — \$65,000

Lutheran Association of Missionary Pilots (LAMP) Ministry, Inc. has been using small aircraft to take the Gospel message to the Indigenous people in the most remote areas of northern Canada. Each year, hundreds of volunteer missionaries from the United States travel to teach vacation Bible school to thousands of children in

remote northern communities. LAMP's ministry is highly dependent on the two aircrafts that they use in order to get their missionaries to these places so they can bring the Gospel of Jesus Christ to those who so desperately need to hear the Good News. The aircraft has evolved over the years, and upgrades must be made to ensure safety and the ability for LAMP's missionaries and pilots to reach remote communities only accessible by air. Avionic instrument upgrades in the aircrafts are a costly investment. The Garmin GTX 345 model works best, not only with classical ground-based radar systems, but it also provides ADS-B input and output for both the American and Canadian/Aireon systems.

# **Building Maintenance Update**

In approximately four months over \$100,000 has been generously given for the Building Maintenance items we highlighted in a letter at the beginning of December. Thank you to everyone who has contributed, the response has been amazing!

At the March Church Council meeting, the council and staff discussed prioritizing the order in which the maintenance items should be completed. The projects have been placed into the following order:

**Priority 1** – Drainage/Landscaping and Roof Repairs that contribute to water infiltration issues

Priority 2 – Once water issues have been mitigated, focus on interior with flooring replacement

Ongoing – Replacement of five original HVAC units

We are getting updated quotes on these items. Our original estimate of these two items together was approximately \$265,000. With the funds already given we are hoping to start work on the landscaping/drainage soon. Additional funds will be needed before we are able to start on replacing/repairing the roof.

We will continue to provide updates as these items progress. Your prayers and contributions are greatly appreciated as we hope to get these items started soon.

As Easter quickly approaches, it reminds us of God's never-ending love for us. Let us praise and worship God for His endless blessings.
