Restore/Renew/Forgive

It happens every day. You use a piece of paper to do some calculations or jot down a list of some items you need to pick up – as soon as your problem is solved or your goods assembled, you throw the paper away. It makes sense. The paper is no longer useful – it's clutter if you keep it.

Your watch stops working and you determine it's more than the battery? It's now trash. The plastic beagle puppy dog gets chewed up by the real dog? Time to get tossed. The ceramic snowman cookie jar smashes when it's dropped on the floor? Out with the garbage. The springs on the couch have sprung and the cushions are frayed and split open? Find the dumpster or the back of a pickup headed for the landfill. Sometimes all it takes is for the pattern of the fabric to not fit the décor.

When the things we hold reach the end of their usefulness, they will soon be discarded. They've lost their value. We can talk recycle when it comes to many materials, but the original item no longer holds its purpose.

But you and I are different.

I may once in a while feel old and worn out. It might seem that I'm broken and useless. Someone might even tell me I cause too many conflicts or always get in the way. I might appear to impose a burden on the people around me. I may have messed up when I was being counted on. I may feel tarnished or even dirtied beyond recognition. But God didn't create me to simply be discarded when things go wrong. Same for you.

When talking about you and me and the failings that appear in us, God's Word introduces ideas such as *new creation, redeemed, treasured, forgiven, great value, cleansed, restored, healed, renewed, reconciled.*

God's interaction with us involves *mercy*, grace, patience, forbearance, kindness, listening, understanding, compassion, joy.

God leads us to new roads of *confession*, humility, repentance, changed vision, forgiveness, mercy, grace, patience, forbearance, kindness, listening, understanding, compassion, joy.

During the Sundays of Lent, our series *Restore, Renew, Forgive* will affirm our value to God and to one another. We'll consider how our value calls for us to seek resolution when conflict tempts us to simply toss relationships in the trash. We'll speak about confession, absolution, restoration, and renewal. You are valuable to God!

Our Children: His Treasure Capital Campaign Receives \$1 Million Gift

We are delighted and humbled to share that the *Our Children: His Treasure* Capital Campaign received a \$1 million donation from a dear friend of the school, who wishes to remain anonymous. Part of the gift completes the donor's faith promise pledge to these new early childhood classrooms. The balance of the gift will be used to pay ongoing construction costs for the addition.

As you may recall, in June 2022, the Association Voters approved this fourclassroom/new Learning Center addition to our current Early Childhood Center, to serve a dire community need and a long SFLS waiting list for infant and toddler education/care.

The project cost, excluding furnishings, was \$2,137,400, to be funded by ongoing campaign cash and pledges—then totaling \$1,121,283—and a LCEF construction loan of \$1.1 million. As of December 31, 2022, we now have \$2,042,920 in cash and pledges, meaning that our LCEF construction loan will be dramatically reduced. Praise be to God!

This addition is slated to be completed later this spring, just in time to open classrooms in the fall of 2023. It will serve our Lord and regional community needs for generations to come, allowing us to educate and share the good news of Jesus Christ with approximately 250 early childhood children and their families each year. It will also provide us with more flexible classroom use in our growing elementary grades.
