

"Waiting Is The Hardest Part"

As many of you know, I spend the third week every June helping lead Camp Minneboji at Camp Okoboji in Iowa. I have been doing it for four of the five years I have been in South Dakota and I can say that it is the highlight of my summer... Now, it's exhausting: physically, mentally, and spiritually, but the rewards far out way the need for caffeine. And this year was no different, actually, I think this year was one of the best so far, well, except for the rain...lots of rain.

But it was in the rain, in a gazebo on the way to the cabins, that I found myself having a conversation. And as I sat their, already soaked from the downpour of rain, with a group of campers already soaked from the rain...all of us questioning our life choices, I decided to pass the time by asking what was their favorite part of camp. I got all kinds of answers, all with excited anticipation of getting to do whatever the activity they were describing. Except for one little girl. As she gave her answer, she looked off into the storm clouds with the wisdom of a seasoned camp veteran and said, "Yeah... but, waiting is the hardest part".

And in that moment, I felt her pain... Waiting really is the hardest part. I wanted to tell her that the thunder storm we were all so eagerly waiting to pass was just the beginning of a life filled with waiting. And as we grow older the waiting never changes, it's just that our focus shifts. One day we are waiting for the rain to stop, the next day we're waiting to see if we get that job, or meet that person that will make your life complete...And before you know it, if your like me, you find yourself facing a tough decision and all you can do is wait... Waiting is the hardest part. And in that

waiting it begins to feel like maybe God is absent. Maybe He has forgotten about me? Maybe His lack of interest in my problems is an answer to fumble forward in the dark until I force an answer?

So, what can you do? Well, let me remind you that God's timing is perfect. Not only is His timing perfect, but God's plans are perfect, because He is perfect (Psalm 18:30). Too often, we think we know what's best, and if the Lord would just hurry up and do what we want, this would all be easier... But what if in our effort to rush through life, we're missing out on something greater than the thing we're waiting for? I want you to stop and read that last sentence again!

God promises to be our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble. He tells us not to fear because He upholds us with His righteous right hand (Psalm 46:1, Isaiah 41:10). Waiting has its rewards, if we're willing to wait. As we persevere through seasons of waiting, our faith (in Him) grows. The best questions we can ask when we're waiting are the ones that help us understand what God wants to show us in the meantime...in the waiting.

So ask yourself: Am I spending time listening to God and listening for God? Am I spending time with Him in His Word? What is the Lord teaching me during this phase of my life? And lastly, what can I do to be ready for God to move?

"As for me, I will look to the Lord; I will wait for the God of my salvation; my God will hear me. (Micah 7:7)...Even in the rain.

APOSTLES CREED: 2nd ARTICLE & Meaning

He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty. I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord, who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death, that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity. 



LUTHERAN IN WOMEN (LWML)

Our Biennial SD District LWML Convention was held on June 6 & 7 in Aberdeen. Memorial was represented by 6 of our members and 1 pastor. We selected 15 mission grants totaling \$65,000, to be funded during the 2024-2026 biennium. We also revised the District By-laws and had a blessed time visiting with old LWML friends and meeting new ones!

The next Convention is our National Convention in Omaha, NE on June 26-29, 2025. The theme is "Growing in God's Grace" based on 2 Peter 3:18. Start making plans to attend this National Convention!! Our National Mission Grant for June was "Sharing Christ Crucified with High School Youth for \$35,000 – PAID IN FULL. This is for Lutheran High School of Greater New Orleans. This school was devastated by Hurricane Ida, and the funds are being used for construction costs to rebuild. This grant will be matched by 5 generous donors and will be used to pay the tuition costs of ten students!

Our National Mission Grant for July is "Care for Street Children of Western Kenya" – Capstone Ministries for \$50,000 and is has been partially paid - \$28,418. This grant will provide educational scholarships for day and boarding school as well as vocational training for 52 children. It will also provide 100 Bibles and catechisms, translated into Swahili for 17 Bible study groups.

The Diaper Derby was a success this year! We collected 2,014 diapers and 2,736 wipes. All will be given to the Alpa Center!!

We have taken a hiatus from meeting this summer and will resume our meetings in September. More information to come for this!
