Why Lent?

"By the sweat of your brow you will eat your food until you return to the ground, since from it you were taken; for dust you are and to dust you will return." - Genesis 3:19

Each year these familiar words from Genesis usher us into the season of Lent. As ashes are smeared across our foreheads we hear, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." It's a reminder of our mortality. And, more importantly, it's a reminder of God's grace. Without it, we sinners would know only pain, suffering, and death. By it, we know hope, joy, love, and life. But, what about the rest of the season? What is it? How did it come to be? Why should we lean into it and make it a part of our regular faith practice?

Well, originally, the practice of preparation for Easter (or Lent) was fasting for two days. Beginning on Good Friday and ending with the celebration of Easter. The idea behind this was that it equaled the time Jesus spent in the tomb.

Generations that followed increased the period of fasting to six days which was also the amount of time catechumens (or New Christians) spent in preparation for the reception of Baptism and the Lord's Supper that they would first receive at the Easter Saturday vigil and Easter morning service. Over time, the length of preparation for Easter increased from one week to three weeks, then to six weeks, usually excluding Sundays, which were held by Christians as "mini" Easters.

In Jerusalem, as early as the Fourth Century, Christians fasted for forty days in preparation for Easter. The forty days consisted of five days a week for eight weeks. These forty days symbolized the forty days that Moses dwelled on Mount Sinai (Exodus 24:18), the forty days that Elijah journeyed to Mount Horeb (1 Kings 19:8), and the forty days that Jesus fasted in the wilderness (Matt. 4:2). It wasn't until the Seventh Century, that the western church decided to include the four days that preceded the first Sunday of preparation which became known as Ash Wednesday.

During the time of the Reformation, Martin Luther continued to observe this practice and, as a result, the Lutheran church has continued this practice. Now, Ash Wednesday begins the season of Lent with its conclusion being Holy Saturday, the day before Christ's resurrection. Because Sundays are mini-Easters, each Sunday in Lent is (in Lent) and not (of Lent) therefore not counted toward the forty days.

But why continue the practice today? Well, I'm of the opinion that engaging Lent as a faith practice is one of the most valuable regular rhythms available to us in the church. In a world of instant gratification, we rarely deny ourselves of anything or actually pause long enough to look up from our busy lives to be reminded of the grace we receive over and over again. Yet, Lent invites us to do just that. To spend time... Time with God and time in His Word.

And the good news is, God gives you a gift during this Lenten season: an opportunity to refocus. To zero in on what is important. To redirect your eyes away from your (dusty) self and return your gaze in the proper, life-giving direction: toward Jesus.
