As we are in the midst of yet another summer, an article about ice cream seemed appropriate. This is not my story and the author is unknown...

Last week, I took my children to a restaurant. My 6-year-old son had asked if he could say Grace. As we bowed our heads, he said "God is good, God is great, thank you for the food, and I would even thank you more if Mom gets us ice cream for dessert, and liberty justice for all, AMEN".

Along with the laughter from the other customers nearby, I heard a woman remark "that's what's wrong with this country...kids today don't even know how to pray, asking God for ice cream. Why I never...!"

Hearing this, my son burst into tears and asked me "Did I do it wrong? Is God mad at me?" As I held him and assured him that he had done a terrific job and God was certainly NOT mad at him, an elderly gentleman approached the table. He winked at my son and said, "I happen to know that God thought that was a great prayer." "Really?" my son asked. "Cross my heart" said the man. Then, in a whisper, the man added (indicating the woman whose remark had started this whole thing) "Too bad she never asks God for ice cream. A little ice cream is good for the soul sometimes."

Naturally, I bought my kids ice cream at the end of our meal. My son stared at his for a moment and then did something I will remember

for the rest of my life. He picked up his sundae, and without a word, walked over and placed it in front of the woman. With a big smile he told her "Here, this is for you. Ice cream is good for the soul sometimes, and my soul is good already."

How are things with your soul today? I'm always in the mood for a little ice cream if you'd like to join me...because ice cream fixes everything.

They do so by intentionally nurturing fruit of the spirit qualities within students as they study God's Word alongside Peace-WiseKids and Youth Curriculum. Peace-Wise publishes curriculum and resources that teach Christ-centered conflict resolution and reconciliation skills in an effort to let biblical principles guide people in conflict and relationships.

A recent NPR article, published shortly after the tragedy in Uvalde, TX, shares the following about supporting the social and emotional needs of learners:

"But experts say schools should actually focus on softening to support the social and emotional needs of students."

'Our first preventative strategy should be to make sure kids are respected, that they feel connected and belong in schools,' says Odis Johnson Jr., of Johns Hopkins University's Center for Safe and Healthy Schools.

That means building kids' skills around conflict resolution, stress management and empathy for their fellow classmates – skills that can help reduce all sorts of unwanted behaviors, including fighting and bullying.

In its report, the Secret Service found most of the school attackers they studied had been bullied."

It's no coincidence that these researchbased best practices are already in use at SFLS—we know the teaching of these soft skills is God-pleasing, will increase safety in our school, and will help our children develop into successful college students, community members, employees, spouses, and parents when they graduate from high school and enter the complex world of adulthood.

Monday, July 25th is surgery, the 2nd day of VBS.....so folks, I am needing your help to get VBS in shape so that I can go be with my parents during this time. I am busy recruiting and getting leaders secured so that VBS will be the best week of the summer for all the kids that attend.

Get Involved

Many hands make light work. This saying was taught to me at an early age. In late June there would be peas to pick in the garden. My mom would round up my two sisters and me and say, "Many hands make light work". We would be bent over our ice cream buckets eating as many peas as we put in the bucket, but my mom was thankful for our help. Another job that we would work on as a family was not nearly as pleasing as picking (and eating) peas... butchering chickens. We would work assembly line style and butcher chickens all day. My dad and grandpa did the brunt of the work, but we would help cut up the chicken and pick it clean. The freezer would be full at the end of the day and we would enjoy fried chicken all year round. With everyone working together, the job got done quicker.

This motto, many hands make light work, is something that I have tried to teach my children. In the fall we split firewood and stack it in the barn to use in our wood burning stove throughout the winter. When

we all work together, the job not only gets done faster, but it is also much more enjoyable. Whether cleaning the house, carrying in the groceries, or picking up sticks in the yard...my kids have heard me say, "Many hands make light work" many times.

This is also something that I have seen demonstrated at Memorial. During the Memorial Day servant event, we had over 80 members work on projects throughout the church. Landscaping was fixed, meals were packed, and letters were written. Other ministries that use many hands to lighten the workload include Comfort Meals, Vacation Bible School, and the annual book sale. As I embrace the role as Director of Ministry Involvement, I want to encourage each of you with this passage from Romans 12:4-8, "Just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we who are many form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. We have different gifts, according to the grace given us. If a man's

gift is prophesying, let him use it in proportion to his faith. If it is serving, let him serve; if it is teaching, let him teach; if it is f to the needs others, let him give generously; if it is leadership, let him govern diligently; if it is showing mercy, let him do it cheerfully."

God has given each of us unique spiritual gifts. I want to help you unpack your gifts and use them in a way that will bring joy to you and those around you. I am putting together an updated Ministry Interest Survey that I will be sending out in the fall. It will highlight areas of ministries in our church and ways that you could be involved in those ministries. It is my desire to help connect you to other members of the church and to Jesus. When our many hands work together, we do God's amazing work.
