"Christ has risen! Christ has risen indeed, Alleluia!" I don't think I will ever get tired of saying that. In fact I think we don't say it enough. We tend to resign this phrase to only the Easter season, as if this is the only time we are allowed to proclaim this amazingly complex, yet seemingly simple promise.

We are Easter people and we live Easter lives. There is a quote from Pope John Paul the 2nd which I really like. He said, "We do not pretend that life is all beauty. (I love that line) We are aware of darkness and sin, of poverty and pain. But we know Jesus has conquered sin and passed through His own pain to the glory of the Resurrection. And we live in the light of this Mystery – the mystery of His Death and Resurrection. "We are an Easter People and Alleluia is our song!"

Now, I could just end it here and say Amen. After all, we are Easter people, we believe Jesus rose from the dead and that we, too, will one day be resurrected. There is great joy that comes in this promise. But, in the meantime, though ... in the meantime, life continues and people suffer, the answers we want don't come, and much of

the world around us acts as if there is no resurrection at all. What then do we do with this proclamation of being Easter people?

Well, we live Easter lives. We take Jesus at His word, because through His word...we are forever changed.

We are the Body of Christ. This is not merely a nice metaphor; it speaks a reality by which we live as Easter people. Jesus now is with us, within us, and outside us. He is made present in others. Others in the body of Christ and especially in those who need our love the most, those we can feed, clothe, visit, heal, forgive, and love.

Easter is not magical. It is transcendent. Jesus is not somewhere else. Christ is everywherethrough Him all creation holds together. He lives and breathes through His body, the Church.

So what does it mean to live as Easter people? It means we live as a people, all parts of Christ's Body working together toward a single purpose: love. The unselfish love that was poured out upon you. After all, We are an Easter People and Alleluia is our song! We are not looking for a shallow joy but rather a joy that comes from faith, a faith that grows through unselfish love.

Updates from The Church Council

Greetings from your Church Council! Last month our general cash position was highlighted, and the deficit we are currently running. March continued to see our regular operating expenses outpace our general giving. April giving was up and will be a positive month toward the overall general cash position. At the time of this newsletter, we don't have the final numbers available for April. We are hopeful we will see more months like April throughout the year to ensure the deficit does not continue to grow. We will continue to provide updates on this in the months to come.

Building updates began the week of April 24th in the original part of our building! This project is starting in Café Logos as well as the main bathrooms. As things progress work will move to the main entrance, hallways, nursery, classrooms, sanctuary, and kitchen. We are anticipating this project will take approximately 3 months to complete. Please continue to look for updates as certain parts of the building will be unavailable at different times throughout the project. This project is being funded by the Building Maintenance fund along with funds from the estate gift that was received last year. We are hoping to raise an additional \$150,000 -\$165,000 towards the project. If you would like to make a financial contribution to the project, you can do so by contributing to the Building Maintenance Fund.

If you look at the building loan update posted in this newsletter as well as our Sunday bulletins, we crossed another milestone as the loan balance is now under \$200,000! The loan is on target to be paid off no later than April 15, 2024.

ROMALD MCDONALD HOUSE CHARTTES This is an ongoing project at Memorial. There is a jar on the gray slat board for the poop tabs. The aluminum is sold and the money is put back into the Ronald McDonald House Program. Last year \$30,000 was raised state wide in pop tab money for South Dakota.

Ronald McDonald Houses provide a temporary home-awayfrom-home for families of seriously ill or injured children receiving treatment at nearby medical facilities. The Houses help keep families together by offering a safe, supportive, welcoming environment that gives guests a sense of normalcy and lets caregivers focus on the needs of the young patients.

Ronald McDonald House Charities is a service-focused organization, committed to the safety, security, and comfort of guests. We are sensitive to the needs of guest families 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. All families referred to the Houses are welcomed with open arms regardless of their financial situation.

Thanks to the people who brought socks for Seats and Socks. They will be distributed to the nonprofit agencies as needed.


Thank you to all who brought lids for the Sioux Falls Lutheran School art project. We have enough lids at this time. When the project is complete, a photo of the project will be shown.


