Summer's a Great Time to Say "Welcome!"

Wouldn't you agree? This past Memorial Day weekend really helped us feel that summer is actually here. School's out for most. Graduations have pretty much happened. The trees are wearing their summer clothes. The weather's been warm, and I believe that the last few chunks of ice have finally worked their way out of our lakes. Summer's here to stay!!! . . . for a while, anyway.

Though this often seems to be the case at Memorial, summer is a time when you may especially see a lot of unfamiliar people worshiping with you in church. They may be here because they're visiting family or friends here in Sioux Falls. They may just be passing through and found our church's website. Perhaps they're looking for a church home. Maybe they've just moved into our area. Whatever is the case, let's be ready to help all our visitors feel very welcome. Here are a few encouragements:

- 1. Don't be afraid to ask for the name of somebody you meet. If you can use a person's first name in your conversation a couple of times, it will help you better remember him or her and help that person feel valued.
- 2. If you see the same person or family next week and you've forgotten their name (that may likely happen) don't be afraid to ask again! You can say something like: "It's great to see you again this week. I don't always remember names very well...could you just help me with your name again?" There are some people that I've had to come to more than once with that reason to ask for their name again. My only other option is to just not worry about who they are and I don't think that's a very good option.

- 3. Many people who visit at Memorial are looking for a church home that really cares about their children. When you welcome adults who come with children, please welcome the kids also. Share your name first. Then you might simply ask: "Are there any special summer activities you like to do?" Ask another question or two about the activity, and invite the young person share his/her name before you say "thanks for telling me a little bit about yourself." Some kids will be pretty shy and won't share a great deal. Others will keep you busy for the next 10 minutes. In either case, you will have made a new friend!
- 4. Invite ---- to your home, to a Bible Study, to a fellowship group gathering.
- 5. The same thoughts above always apply to keeping in touch with our fellow members!

Thanks for helping people feel welcome here at Memorial! This congregation is known by many as a very friendly congregation that welcomed them in. Let's make sure we keep our arms wide open. It helps invite people to connect to God's life-giving gifts through His Word. It helps present the picture of Jesus' open arms in receiving all His children.

Updates from The Church Council

Greetings from your Church Council!

Our general cash position and the deficit we are currently running continues to be an area of focus for the council. April giving was strong, and we had a surplus for the month of approximately \$27,000 after regular operating expenses were paid. This certainly helps our overall general cash position however there is still a deficit for 2023 in addition to the carryover we had for 2022. We are hopeful we will see more months like April throughout the year to ensure the deficit does not continue to grow. We will continue to provide updates on this in the months to come.

The construction is progressing well in the original part of our building! Café Logos will soon be complete, and we hope to be using this room again soon. Progress on the hallway outside the sanctuary, nursery, restrooms, and main entrance are moving along while demolition moves further down the east hallway and into the classrooms. This project is being funded by our Building

Maintenance fund along with funds from the estate gift that was received last year. We are hoping to raise an additional \$150,000 - \$165,000 towards the project. If you would like to make a financial contribution to the project, you can do so by contributing to the Building Maintenance Fund. We will be taking a special offering on Sunday, July 9th to support our Building Maintenance Fund.

Landscaping updates have restarted after taking the winter months off. Some new plants will be going in the areas that were updated last summer and fall, and work around the east entrance will be completed soon. Lighting updates around the exterior of the building have also resumed and will be completed soon.


