Updates from The Church Council

The start of October brings several exciting updates we want to share with you!

The remodel is nearing 100% completion. During the last two weeks of September, new material arrived for the stair nose of the chancel to correct the installation issues we had during the remodel. Thanks again for your patience and contributions towards this significant project!

As we have mentioned throughout 2023 our general giving has been running short of the church's general operating expenses. In September Memorial Lutheran received a significant undesignated general offering! We anticipate that this gift, combined with all our September offerings will close the gap and our 2023 general offerings and expenses will be approximately even as of the end of September! The year-to-date numbers posted in the weekly bulletins will be updated soon to reflect this.

Our building loan now has a balance of \$102,774! In September we were able to make another principal payment of \$6,815

from designated offerings and the loan will now be paid off no later than March 2024! At the end of this year the balance will be just over \$50,000, minus any contributions we received towards the principal of the loan in the last 3 months of 2023.

The Lord continues to bless Memorial Lutheran Church and we have so much to celebrate and be thankful for! To God be the glory! In October the council will begin work on the 2024 budget. We ask for your prayers as we look for His guidance to manage the resources He has blessed our congregation with. The budget, election of council members and many other exciting updates will be provided at our Annual Meeting on Sunday, January 21, 2024 at 1:00pm. Please mark your calendars now and plan to attend!


ZINGERS



Parents who are in a special program are invited to shop at the store. They pay only 10% of the price of the item. For each child, they choose 3 gifts or up to \$8. This program gives parents a choice in buying gifts and holds them accountable (it is not just a hand out). Families can only be in the program for 2 years and then they are on their own with support from Community Outreach. Foster parents also get one night of shopping at the store for children that they currently have in their homes. Idea lists will be available for you on Oct 29th.



They have assisted orphans, carried out domestic disaster relief, gathered, sorted, packed, & distributed food, clothing, medical supplies, equipment, & educational materials for those in need in the U.S. & internationally. The original facility in Norfolk, NE, is outdated and lacking adequate space to carry out their expanding work. This grant will help OGT complete their building project.

LWML South Dakota District Mites in Action: Spanish Braille Bibles for Central and South America - Lutheran Braille Workers (LBW)— \$5,000. LBW is the only Lutheran organization which intentionally serves people who are blind or visually impaired both in the United States and across all continents, and the world's largest nonprofit producer of Braille, specialized large print, and audio Christian materials.

LBW have been asked to produce over 20,000 volumes of Spanish Braille Bibles for use in Central and South America. This grant would help cover the cost of paper, cardboard and other supplies for the production of 1,000 of the Bibles.
