



## HAPPY NEW YEAR!

The question that always get's asked after this statement is, "what is your new year's resolution?" And it's not uncommon for people at this time of the year, in addition to making resolutions, to compose a mental wish list. As we flip the page of the calendar and think about what the future may hold, we have some, often specific, ways that we would like for it to unfold. You might want a new job or for someone's health to improve or for family members to get along better. "I wish that...." You fill in the blanks.

But wishes are usually for things over which we have no control. We know how we would like for things to turn out, but in reality they could go either way, up or down, good or bad. We'll have to wait and see.

I don't suppose there is anything wrong with Christians having a wish list, but there isn't anything scriptural or theological that compels us to wish. Hope (on the other hand) is another matter. As Christ followers, our hope Is based on the certainty that we are loved by God, and that, if we are committed to God's will, ultimately our lives are blessed. Now, that doesn't mean we get everything on our wish list, but it does mean, no matter how difficult life is, God is with us. That was the explicit meaning of the birth of Christ we have just celebrated: Immanuel, "God with us."

The Apostle Paul, in seeking to encourage his fellow Christians, wrote that through their suffering they would develop endurance, and their endurance would produce character, and as people of character they would have hope. Then he said, "Hope does not disappoint, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us" (Romans 5:5).

I have a "hope" list. And it probably includes a lot of the same things that are on your list. But what happens when, as the year goes by, the things on that list don't seem to go the way we thought they would? After all, that's what new year resolutions do...right? Well, I leave you with these words of encouragement.

Hope...Not hope with your fingers crossed and eyes closed. But hope based on the certainty that, if these are the things that God desires for us, they will be accomplished not through our strength, but through the power of Christ's Spirit at work among us and in us and through us...Hope in a God that went through great lengths to always be with us.







## Equipping Students to Serve the World as Peacemakers

In the midst of the most conflict-ridden time our country has experienced in decades, Christian educators at Sioux Falls Lutheran School are witnessing the difference that cultivating a culture of peace can have in the lives of students, families, and communities.

"We are sinners who find our way into conflict just like the rest of the world," Elementary Principal Brenda Bernard said. "And while we cannot avoid it, we can certainly prepare students to navigate conflict in a way that answers God's call for Christians to serve the world as peacemakers."

Teachers at SFLS are equipping students for that calling daily by using resources from Peace-WiseKids and PeaceWiseYouth curriculum to teach the skills they need to stay on top of conflict.

It all starts with a concept called the slippery slope. When confronted with challenging relationships and conflict, our natural human reactions involve slipping down the sides of the slope into "peace-breaking" attack mode or "peace-faking" escape mode. While those responses are natural, neither provide a healthy avenue for working through the conflict toward reconciliation. However, students can stay safe, healthy, and resolve matters in God-pleasing ways when they use the skills they learn to stay in the "peace-making" zone.


