Rich Bimler, one of our church body's early DCE's, shared the story of two caterpillars who were passing by one another on a tree branch. While sharing a friendly greeting, they were distracted by a butterfly flitting and flying high above them. One caterpillar, shaking its head, warily said to her friend, "Mark my words, Anastasia, you'll never get me up in one of those!"

Sometimes our vision and experience is too earthbound to recognize everything we truly are. But the Good News of Easter reassures us that we have more life to live than what we see on this side of the grave! Just as our Savior rose from the tomb on that wonderful Easter morning, so God promises that we too shall rise, even though we die! Caterpillars may shake their heads and wonder how life could be anything more than getting through the day. Now start imagining how these possibilities apply for living your day today!
