"Every Morning Is Easter Morning!"

An Easter chorus written by Richard Avery and Don Marsh sings:

"Every morning is Easter morning from now on-Every day is resurrection day; the past is over and gone!"

Easter's message is simple and clear: Jesus Christ has entered our lives . . . giving His own life . . . rising with new life . . . so that every day we live is a celebration of hope, of forgiveness, of renewal. Again, the message? Jesus simply said, "Because I live, you also shall live!" *(John 14:19b. I also invite you to read John 11:25-26 & 1 Corinthians 15:51-58.)*

Can you imagine observing Easter without this message? Could we really get all that excited over a short holiday break from work or school? . . . or a couple extra pounds of chocolate bunnies, marshmallow chickies, and jelly beans? . . . A few new spring clothes which might get worn through the middle of summer, and maybe twice more next year? What would really be the point?

The song continues:

"Good-bye guilt, good-bye fear, good riddance! Hello, Lord, Hello, sun! I am one of the Easter People! My new life has begun!"

What does Easter mean for you? What does it mean for the Church? And what does it mean for many who have not been able to see beyond the surface shine of a few happy spring experiences. We who are "Easter people," who know of Jesus' resurrection, have the most important Good News to share with a world of people who are often starved from lack of good news.

Many things threaten to starve us from hearing good news. Illness; falling out with a friend; mistake at work; dispute with a neighbor; argument with a family member; a fall to temptation – maybe even *again*, failure to accomplish a task; the seeming finality of death; ______ fill in your own blank. Any one or combination of these life experiences can wipe out any sense of well-being I may try to cling to – unless I understand the message of Jesus' resurrection.

If Jesus has not risen from the dead, what He did to give to us the forgiveness of sins is buried forever with a dead man. If Jesus has not risen from the dead, the hope and promise of everlasting life with God is hollow and empty. We're left to somehow try to make it through *this* life as best as we can – and then comes the end. But He *has* risen from the dead! And so each morning echoes the promise of new life. "The past is over and gone" – whether it's the past of failure, guilt, or the threats that lurk in the valley of the shadow of death. "Goodbye, guilt! Goodbye, fear!" Or shall we say, "Good riddance!"

"EVERY MORNING IS EASTER MORNING!" Do you need to hear this Good News? I sure do. Can you think of anyone else who may need to hear this message or experience it from you?

God's resurrection blessings!

Updates from The Church Council

Greetings from your Church Council!

As the first quarter of 2023 ends, we felt it was important to provide some updates to the congregation that come from our monthly Church Council meetings.

In late February our storage shed on the north side of the building was vandalized. Fortunately, not much was stolen, however there was damage done to the door. Head Trustee Casey Bialas had been looking into needed repairs or replacement of the shed over the past several months, as it is showing its age. The break in and damage of the shed has caused some added urgency and options for replacing the shed are being explored. We hope to share more on this soon as plans come together.

Thus far in 2023 our general giving has been coming up short of the church's general operating expenses. This was mentioned at the annual meeting in

January, as we closed out 2022 with a shortfall of approximately \$23,000. Thus far in 2023, general giving has been approximately \$25,000 less than our operating expenses. Our general cash position is reviewed monthly and tracked separate from gifts that are given as designated offerings, as well as the large estate gift that was received last year. The mission gifts the church has been making to other organizations along with several other projects that either have been or will be completed, are being funded from designated offerings or the estate gift without an impact to the general fund. An increase in general giving is needed to ensure this deficit does not continue to grow. We will continue to provide updates on this in the months to come.

Building maintenance items that we have been discussing for over a year now are continuing to move forward and many of them will soon become a reality. The Building Maintenance fund along with funds from the estate gift will allow us to move forward with several items this spring and summer. We will have some construction happening in the original part of our building as we

NEWS FROM THE GARAGE:

"Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again." Martha said to him, "I know that he will rise again in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. 


